The Stephen D. Paine Scholarship is designed to support students who are entering their final year in studio art programs at colleges in the city of Boston. As young artists conclude their undergraduate studies, the Boston Art Dealers Association (BADA) would like to extend financial assistance in order to support their commitment to the making of art.

The scholarship is established in memory of Stephen D. Paine, who died in the fall of 1997 at the age of 65. Stephen was passionate about the visual arts and dedicated to supporting arts education through his involvement with numerous Boston-area institutions. In his capacity as a founding partner at Wellington Management in Boston, he formed an extensive corporate art collection that includes the work of scores of artists with ties to Boston. With his wife Susan W. Paine, he built an impressive private collection, supporting the work of both emerging and established artists. Together, these collections stand among the most important in the Boston area.

Stephen was a friend and ally to artists, students, and art professionals. BADA is honored to celebrate his life and his passion through this scholarship.

To be eligible, an applicant must be found eligible for financial aid by the school. Applicants must be entering their final year in a studio art program or studio art major and may be working in any visual art medium.

It is expected that available funds will permit three scholarships of \$4000 to be awarded each year, in the form of cash grants to the recipients. Up to four prizes of \$500 will be awarded as honorable mentions. In addition, all artists receiving funds will be invited to exhibit work in the annual Stephen D. Paine Scholarship Exhibition at the New England School of Art and Design at Suffolk University.

Applications should be submitted to the financial aid offices of participating schools by June 15. The jurying process is managed by The Boston Foundation and The Artists Foundation. Applications will be reviewed anonymously by a juror who will be encouraged to make awards based on the recognition of talent and of the promise for making important work in the future. Awards will be announced in September.

Please submit a maximum of ten slides or ten jpg images or no more than three minutes of videotape. Submissions in other media will not be considered. Please note that the quality of your photographic materials is crucial to the juror's ability to accurately perceive your work. Please also provide a list of titles, dates, materials, and sizes of work depicted, along with any additional information necessary to understand it.

A statement of no more than one page may be included. (The statement is optional, not required, but may help the juror understand your work. If the juror seeks written explanation of your work, your statement may be read in whole or in part.) Your materials will be returned to your financial aid office in September. Awards will be announced in September.
